LANGE'S ESTATE


Lange's vineyard was established in 1997 and is run by the family, including Kim and Chelsea, their children Jack, Ella and Dylan together with Don and Maxine.

The vineyard is situated in the picturesque grape growing region of Frankland River known for producing premium quality fruit - especially Shiraz and Riesling.

Frankland River is tucked away in the far North Western corner of the Great Southern wine region of Western Australia. The climate is Mediterranean with a dominant winter and spring rainfall. It is around 100km from the south coast of Western Australia which keeps it dry during the growing season but is cooled by an afternoon sea breeze which leads to a dry but cool ripening period perfect for varieties such as Shiraz and Riesling.

Our vineyard has a high elevation of close to 300m which is unique for Western Australian conditions and when combined with our red jarrah gravel loam soils they lead to wines of great intensity. We hope you enjoy our wines as much as we do!

FIFTH GENERATION

The Lange family have been cultivating and farming in rural Western Australia for five generations. The tradition continues in Frankland River with Kim and Chelsea and their children.

This story begins in 1890 when William Douglas selected 300 acres of land at Narnarup to become one of the first settlers and became the first generation of Lange's to farm the land.

William Douglas built a large stone house, cleared 12 acres, planted 650 apple trees, 90 cherry trees and grape vines. He drained several acres of rich swamp land to plant potatoes and kept livestock including two horses, two cows and cape barren geese.

Historically, the stock route that passes through Lange Estate was the lifeline of the Frankland River community.

Although primarily used in the late 1800's to move cattle and sheep, the stock route was also used by the local community to travel day to day, acquiring their provisions and securing their livelihoods.

Running from Bridgetown to Mount Barker, this was a vital passage in the area which continues to be used today.

The Lange family is a fifth-generation farming family of Western Australia.

The Travelling Stock Route that runs through the back section of Lange Estate was used by previous generations of the Lange family to move sheep used for wool production. Connecting Bridgetown and Mount Barker, the T.S.R. travels through the Lange's property to make use of two major watering holes along the way – vital to the welfare of the animals and their drovers who were making the long journey.
