

LANGMEIL WINERY

Langmeil Winery is the home of The Freedom 1843 Shiraz vineyard. With a history dating back to 1842, Langmeil Winery represents a place where the cultural beginnings of Barossa blend seamlessly with world-class winemaking. The Lindner family, whose own mark on the Barossa spans six-generations of farming, food and wine, are stewards of this captivating pocket of Barossa Valley.

The property was one of the district's first trading sites, settled by Christian Auricht and his family after they had fled religious persecution in their native country of Prussia. Auricht's legacy survives today both in the meticulously restored village buildings and an iconic vineyard. The Freedom, understood to have been planted by Auricht in 1843, is believed to be the oldest surviving shiraz vineyard in the world.

Australia's famed wine-lifestyle can be experienced with a walk through the beautifully manicured grounds of this charming site that was once Langmeil village. This historic settlement is now passionately preserved by the Lindner family.

A visit to our picturesque cellar door, once the old stables, offers far more than a tasting. You will be introduced to award-winning wines, take a tour of The Freedom 1843 vineyard, and even visit The Freedom Cellar for a private, back vintage experience. All this will be hosted by great characters with passionate knowledge, both of our wines and of Barossa's history.

The Lindner family's commitment to quality is unwavering. Each Langmeil wine is a reflection of the family's pursuit of excellence in their community, and each bears the distinctive hallmarks of its home region. These are wines of The Barossa in South Australia, made with individuality, quality and style.

THE WINEMAKER



Small batch artisan wines are produced from its extraordinary Old Vines, including its famous Barossa Valley shiraz and Eden Valley Riesling. OUR WINES

THE OLD VINE GARDEN RANGE

The Barossa is home to some of the oldest surviving vineyards in the world, including The Freedom 1843 Shiraz Vineyard. This collection, which represents the pinnacle of Langmeil's range, is sourced from selected parcels within these unique Barossa gems. Using a blend of traditional and modern winemaking techniques, Paul Lindner allows site-specific characteristics and microclimates to shine through in each wine's individual style and quality.

These wines are available in limited quantities from low-yielding vineyards.

THE VILLAGE RANGE

This suite of wines is Langmeil's premium regional wine representation. As well as the classic varieties for which Barossa is best known, these wines showcase the emerging, exciting varieties which could shape our region's future. Fashioned from vineyards tended by multi-generational Barossa farming families, they cover many of the original 30 villages of the Barossa, each of which has its own geological and cultural character. These are wines of pure regional and varietal definition and include our famed Valley Floor Shiraz.

THE VALLEY RANGE

Both unique sub-regions that comprise the Barossa GI (Barossa Valley and Eden Valley) are represented here through The Valley Range. A bright, fresh introduction to our Barossa family winery.

Langmeil continues to retain its Five Red Star Rating in the *James Halliday Wine Companion*, placing it in the top 10% of premium Australian producers under the classification of "An outstanding winery capable of producing wines of the highest calibre".

The Freedom 1843 Shiraz rose to the category of "Outstanding" in the prestigious *Langton's Classification VII* honour roll in 2018, having joined the roll in 2014 in the category of "Excellent".
