Our Story

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ABOUT US

In 1849 a 30-acre parcel of land on the eastern edge of the Barossa was planted with vines by Samuel and Sidney Smith. Father and son worked together to plant Shiraz and Mataro – varieties that are naturally suited to the loamy soils underfoot.

More than 170 years later Smith's descendants continue to instinctively choose vineyard locations that are best suited to individual grape varieties: Chardonnay and Pinot Noir in Tasmania, Riesling in Eden Valley, Merlot in Wattonbully, Cabernet Sauvignon in Margaret River and Sauvignon Blanc in Marlborough. Through investments of time and patience these vineyards now produce some of the best and most celebrated wines of their variety around the world.

Led by fifth generation vigneron Robert Hill-Smith, these wines of provenance continue to add a distinctly Australian flavour to the old world ideology of terroir – that unique characteristic bestowed on a wine by a particular place.

Together the collection is known as Hill-Smith Family Vineyards.



SUSTAINABLE & VEGAN WINES

At Hill-Smith Family Vineyards, the principal aim is to consistently create a collection of varietal wines that are a true expression of 'country', which not only means landscape but all of the values, resources, stories and cultural obligations associated with 'place'. Our history speaks to innovation and is inspired by a commitment to show leadership in vineyard management, winemaking practice and environmental sustainability.

In our winemaking, the use of natural yeast ferment and the removal of animal based fining agents is extensive. All still table wines made from the 2016 vintage onwards are vegan friendly, and our sparkling wines will follow suit as the reserve wines are diminished.

In our vineyards, we encourage natural biodiversity with minimal human and chemical intervention. This ensures a balanced and healthy environment for our grapes to grow, which is reflected in wines that are true expressions of their terroir.

"We make our wines with the least intervention possible, backed up by as much knowledge and expertise as possible. Examples of this include our now extensive and growing use of natural yeast (wild) ferments in both whites and reds and our commitment not to use animal based fining agents. Not fining is not an excuse to make poor wines but a commitment to get it right in the vineyard and the first stages of the winemaking process. The easy expression of this is to say we are making 'vegan friendly wines' but it goes much deeper than that.

We want to do the right thing and to work with nature. We are committed to sustainable practices, with the belief that the healthier and more bio-diverse the vineyards are the better the wines will be. This includes using organic and biodynamic practices as appropriate and making the most suitable wines from the different regions we have access to."

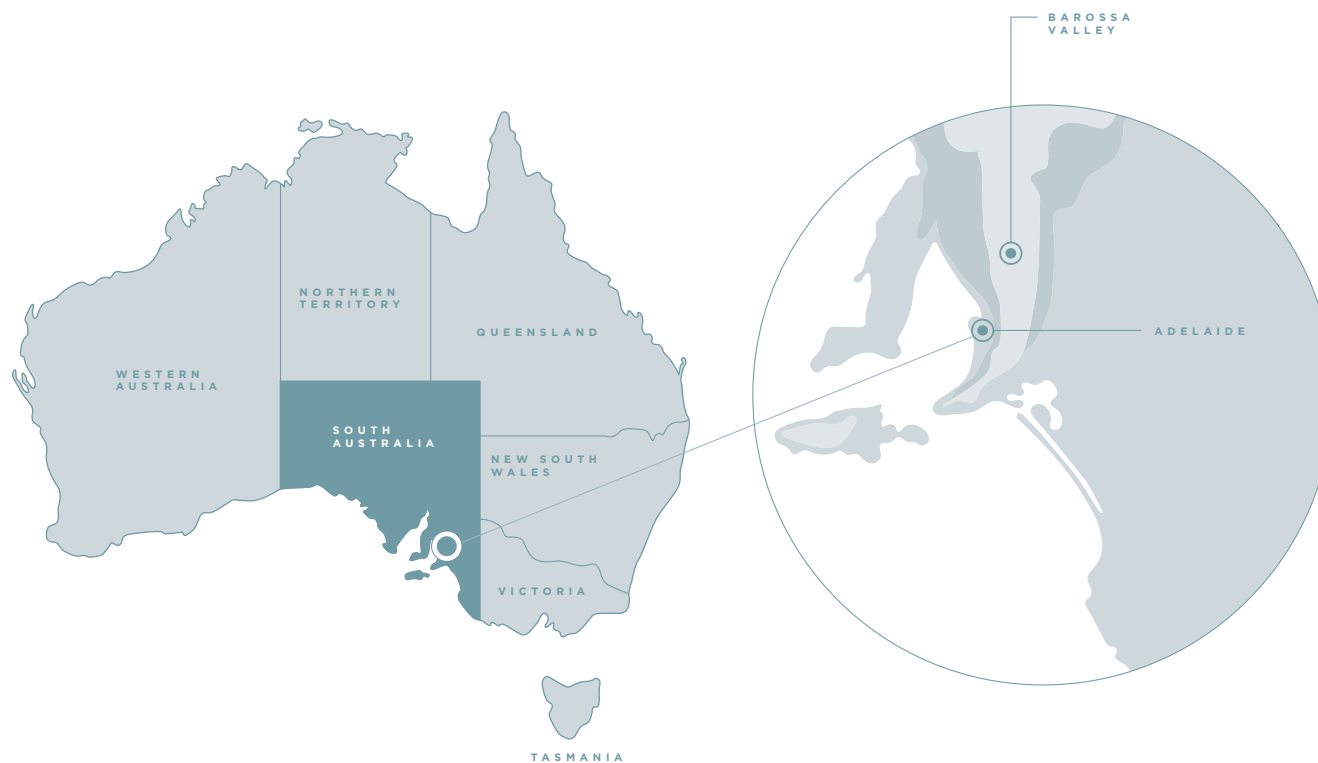

If you could only choose one Australian wine region to truly showcase the history, evolution and revolution of Australian wine then you could do a lot worse than pick the Barossa Valley. There are sixth generation grape growing families in the region, custodians to Australia's largest collection of old vines with blocks dating back to the 1840s.

In recent years, traditional Barossa varieties like Shiraz, Grenache and Mataro have been joined by a new wave of Mediterranean varieties suited to the region's soils and climate. The region has also been invigorated by a new breed of winemakers who have challenged the status quo while still maintaining an inherent love and respect for the Barossa traditions and culture.¹

CLIMATE

The region has a Mediterranean climate ideal for full-bodied red wines, excellent fortified wines and generally robust white wines.

The climate ranges from warm on the valley floor to cool at the higher altitudes in the hills surrounding the Valley.

The region has a large diurnal temperature range, high maximum temperatures, high sunshine days and low humidity and rainfall.

SOIL

The complex system of valleys and twisting hills results in a variety of slopes, aspects and sites.

The soils vary widely, but fall in a family of relatively low-fertility clay loam through to more sandy soils, ranging through grey to brown to red.

As in so much of south-east Australia, acidity increases in the subsoils, restricting root growth and vigour.¹

With intrigue in discovery and sharing the new and exciting, Running with Bulls planted Tempranillo in the Barossa Valley. The variety thrived on the warm valley floor that mirrored the climatic conditions of the Mediterranean. A risk that payed off. Time to be bullish! Grabbing the bull by the horns, Garnacha was released next; juicy, light and lively, reminiscent of European styles that sparked memories of Spanish siestas. Made to share and to enjoy with food.

These Spanish varietals have found a new home in the Barossa Valley.

Picked early from the Barossa floor for a juicy, vibrant Grenache. Wild fermented with whole bunch fruit for texture, spice and intense aroma. Unoaked for freshness and fruit purity, allowing cherry and rhubarb flavours to shine on the palate. Drinks beautifully chilled on a hot day. Perfect with tapas.

Eden Valley

South Australia



Eden Valley, the Barossa's beautiful high country, is one of Australia's premier cool climate wine regions characterised by its rugged beauty and varied topography. Eden Valley wines are distinctive in their character, displaying wonderful aromatics, elegance, complexity and finesse.

With a winemaking history dating back to 1847, Eden Valley is home to some of the world's oldest Shiraz and Riesling vineyards. Traditional grape growing continues with a focus on sustainability and authenticity, with fifth and sixth generations of the original settlers continuing to apply their craft.¹

CLIMATE

Altitude, aspect and slope are all important in determining mesoclimate in this hilly region. Therefore, at an altitude of around 500 metres (1640 feet) the Pewsey Vale, Heggies and High Eden vineyards at the southern end of the Eden Valley are considerably cooler than the more northerly Henschke vineyards at an elevation of 380 to 400 metres (1247 to 1312 feet) around Keyneton.

Overall growing season temperatures are significantly lower than those of the Barossa Valley, and the final stages of ripening and harvesting take place in much cooler conditions.

SOIL

Rolling, exposed hills with moderately steep gradients are commonplace and the correct match of site and variety is critical. As one might expect, given the varied terrain, there are a number of soil types. The most common range from grey to brown in colour, and from loamy sand to clay loams. Ironstone gravels, quartz gravels and rock fragments are present in the surface and subsurface.

These are well suited to dry land viticulture but there are also patches of weaker sandy soils on the slopes, underlain by weathered mica-schists, which have reduced water-holding capacity.¹

The Pewsey Vale Vineyard was established at Eden Valley in 1847 producing some of Australia's first cool climate wines. The early Pewsey Vale Vineyard Rieslings were exported to England where they won numerous awards in the prestigious wine shows of the era. Today, Pewsey Vale Vineyard is a highly esteemed, specialist, single site estate vineyard.

Riesling is our single focus.

Riesling

High in the hills surrounding the Barossa Valley lies Pewsey Vale Vineyard, originally established in 1847 by Englishman Joseph Gilbert. In 1961, pastoralist Geoffrey Angas Parsons became aware his property had once incorporated the region’s earliest vineyard and shared his discovery with good friend and vigneron Wyndham Hill-Smith. In the ensuing twelve months, Wyndham established a contoured Riesling vineyard upon the slopes of the estate. Today, Pewsey Vale Vineyard is a single vineyard dedicated to a single variety – Riesling.

Prima Riesling

Released for the first time from the 2007 vintage the Pewsey Vale Vineyard Prima Riesling is made from vines planted in 1966. Harvested a few weeks earlier than ‘normal’, the final wine has been made in a semi-dry style which retains some of the fruit sugars in balance with the chiseled mineral acidity. The naturally lower alcohol of the wine further heightens its refreshing character. The balance of the wine is succulent, mouth watering and lingering.

This block, planted in 1961, is the dress circle of Pewsey Vale, situated in the centre of the vineyard amphitheatre on a gentle slope that faces due north and embraces the sun.

On every Heggies Vineyard bottle is the image of a man sitting astride his horse and surveying the land. The man's name is Colin Heggie, a local grazier and owner of the picturesque property before he sold it to his old friend, Wyndham Hill Smith. Wyndham had an eye for great vineyard sites and he could see the potential for growing quality grapes on this magnificent sweep of country that had been grazing land. Its rolling hills and native flora showed all the signs of a spectacular cool-climate vineyard site.

The magnificent sweep of country that is the Heggies Vineyard, is situated at an altitude of up to 520m above sea level. This vineyard produces an understated and inspiring example of modern Australian single-vineyard aromatic white wine at it's best. Possessing the individual attributes that can only be found in the cool-climate Heggies Vineyard, in the high country of Eden Valley.

Reserve Chardonnay

Line and length define Heggies Vineyard Reserve Chardonnay. This wine shows a fine restraint in its youth that will gain more depth and complexity with bottle age.

Selected from the most unique site on the vineyard - 'T' block, which has a westerly aspect overlooking the Heggies Lake. Aligned to the prevailing winds, westerly breezes have a cooling influence as they move across the water. A gently sloping block with skeletal soils at the top and deeper at the lake end.

This site was planted in 1992 with three exceptional Bernard Clones 76, 95 and 96.

Estate Botrytis Riesling

The Heggies Vineyard is blessed with a number of different meso climates across the site, with slope and aspect causing significant variances. The vineyard parcel for the Botrytis Riesling almost chooses itself, situated on a gentle westerly slope with trees providing shelter on three sides and a lake forming the border at the base of the vineyard. These factors lead to humid, still conditions and when combined with morning fogs, are perfect for the development of Botrytis cinerea.

South Australia



South Australia is a very important wine producing state responsible for almost 50% of Australia's annual production. It is also home to some of the most famous regions, historic estates and the oldest vines in the country.

Straddling the centre of Australia, South Australia produces the majority of the nation's wine. The state also boasts some of the oldest vines in the world. The venerable old vines found in South Australia's Barossa Valley, McLaren Vale, Clare Valley and Adelaide Hills, through their isolation, survived the great phylloxera plagues that wiped out the vines of North America, Europe and Australia's eastern vineyards.

Quarantine restrictions were introduced that saved South Australia's vines from phylloxera and ensured the state retained its grape growing status.

There is a multitude of different soil types and local mitigating influences such as altitude and cooling

ocean breezes that allow for a wide range of wine styles and qualities. South Australia also has a diverse range of regions from the relatively warm temperate climate of the Barossa Valley, to the maritime precincts of McLaren Vale, the Fleurieu Peninsula's Currency Creek, Langhorne Creek and Southern Fleurieu; the cooler Adelaide Hills region and the hot climate of the Riverland region on the Murray River.¹

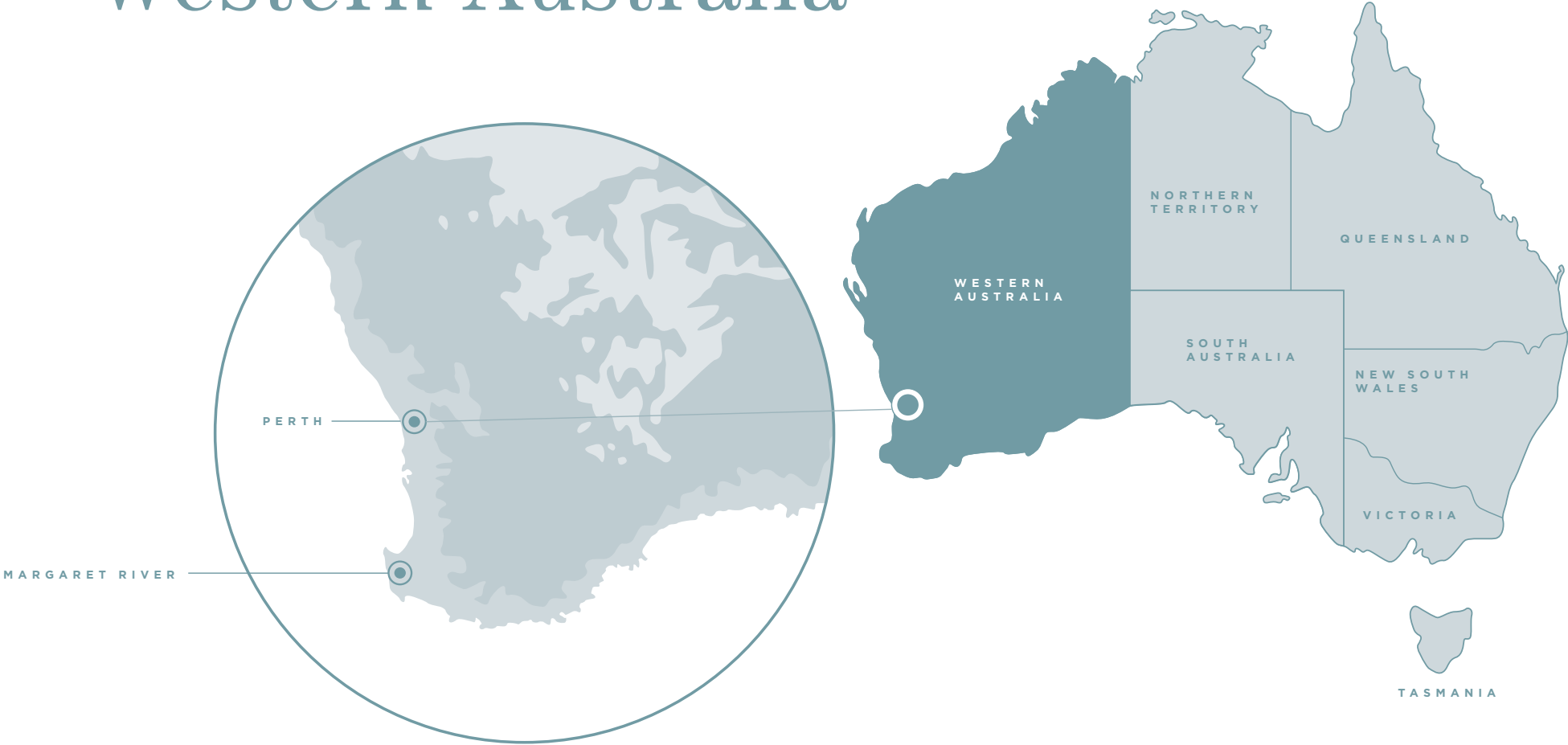

It was the sloping hills overlooking Bass Strait that made the site unique and inspired the Hill-Smith family to purchase the vineyard in 2007, along with distinct single sites around Tasmania in their pursuit to produce the perfect single site Pinot. Despite its deep history, the world is only just discovering Tasmanian Pinot Noir.





Cave Block Chardonnay
