2019 Eden Valley RIESLING

Variety – 100% Riesling

Origin – Eden Valley

Vintage

The 2019 Vintage was perfect with low crops, small berries and a long growing season. Allowing for accumulation of fantastic Riesling flavours.

Vineyards

This Riesling is from the cool, high altitude Eden Valley. The vines are hand pruned and hand-picked, along with the boney skeletal soils and the ideal climate of warm days and cool nights, Riesling thrives and produces wines of pure varietal characters.

Winemaking

Riesling is really made in the vineyard. In the winery all we are trying to do is preserve the natural flavours and purity of the Riesling grape. Picking decisions are very important where we are looking for a balance of fruit and natural acidity. In the winery the grapes are crushed and pressed immediately. With the pressings discarded due to their phenolic content. The juice is chilled and settled for two days. The clear juice is racked off and inoculated with a cultured yeast. The long cool ferment preserves the natural aromas and flavours of the wine. It is then stabilised filtered and bottled. As soon as fermentation is complete.

Tasting Notes

With a pale green hue, this wine has typical Riesling characters with herbal notes and sea spray on the nose. The palate has amazing lime cordial with some sherbet and mint. The citrus flavours flow through the palate, with some nice mid palate mouthfeel. The wine has balanced fruit sweetness and refreshing acidity. It finishes long with abundant length of flavour.

Ageing

This wine drinks well now or will age for up to ten years with careful cellaring.

Food Pairing

Any seafood especially freshly schucked oysters.

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2017 Olive Hill ROUSSANNE-SEMILLON

Variety – Roussanne (67%) and Semillon (33%)

Origin – Barossa Valley

Vintage

2017 was a dry and mild growing season. It began with good winter rains filling the soil profile and ensuring the vines had a fantastic start to the growing season. The ensuing period proved to be quite a cool and mild one by Barossa standards. This was perfect for whites and the resulting wines have exemplified this with elegance, finesse and lifted aromatics.

Vineyards

Even though the Roussanne and Semillon vineyards are right next to each other on the Olive Hill vineyard, the soils in each block are substantially different. The Semillon is on the sandy soils from the ancient river bed which results in fruit with lovely brightness and varietal character. The Roussanne is situated on the clay where the sub soil gives good moisture retention capabilities so the vines roots can “extract” the required amount of moisture. Producing fruit that gives richer more concentrated flavours.

Winemaking

The two varieties were co-fermented, that is they were blended at picking. With the aim of allowing the fruit and varietal characters to shine through. The grapes were hand picked, crushed and juice chilled at the winery as quickly as possible. The grapes were pressed with the free run and pressings cuts kept separate. The juice was then inoculated with a neutral yeast to ensure varietal characters were not masked. Twenty five percent of the juice went into second use French barriques to complete fermentation. After a long and cool fermentation, the wines were matured in tank and barrel for six months before stabilised and filtered prior to bottling.

Tasting Notes

The Barossa has many similarities with the Rhone Valley in France, the home of the Roussanne grape variety. With these similarities in soil and climate, unsurprisingly our version of Roussanne displays all the hallmarks of a classic wine. Bright yellow colour with a tinge of green the nose displays some lovely, lime, honeysuckle and a hint of spice. The palate is wonderfully full and mouth filling with those varietal honeysuckle characters coming to the fore. There is also a hint of spice from the percentage of wine fermented in the French oak barriques. The Semillon adds some complexity with a hint of grassiness and good lemony acid balance. The clean acid finish and vibrancy of the wine will ensure that it gets more complex with age.

Ageing

This wine drinks well now or will age for up to five years with careful cellaring.

Food Pairing

Creamy delicacies such as fish in butter sauce, steamed mussels or pasta in white wine.

Variety

Shiraz 36.5%, Mataro 20.4%, Grenache 20%, Zinfandel 10.5%, Tempranillo 6.1%

Souzao 5.2%, Touriga 1.3%

Origin - Barossa Valley

Vintage

A traditionally wet winter, mild spring and excellent fruit set provided a great start to the 2015 vintage after four vintages with below average yields. Spring was dry and led into a very mild, dry summer with no disease, resulting in fruit with higher natural acidity, and incredible flavour and colour concentration. The mild weather that followed from February allowed for an extended ripening period for later red varieties, such as Grenache and Mataro providing for excellent yields and exceptional quality showing extraordinary flavour, purity of fruit, excellent balance with the potential for excellent ageing.

Vineyards

This wine is from our Vineyard which has deep clay soil over Limestone. This is the perfect soil for red grapes with the vines having to "work hard", thus producing small berries/low crops with great concentration of flavour and tannin structure, that make the wines long lived- The clay in the sub soil gives good moisture retention capabilities so the vines roots can "extract" the required amount of moisture.

Winemaking

All the fruit from the Burge Family Estate is hand-picked ensuring the fruit is in pristine condition when it reaches the winery. Each parcel from the Burge Family Estate vineyard are fermented in separate batches so different winemaking techniques can be employed to build complexity and depth of flavour. Wild fermentation has been encouraged, as well as extended time on skins.

Tasting Notes

Wines with great drinkability, are full of flavor, character and interest. The fact that we use some interesting varieties from Spain and Portugal adds to the complexity and nuances of the wine.

Ageing

This wine can age for up to twenty years with careful cellaring.

Food Pairing

Beef and game, Korean BBQ or Chinese BBQ.

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2015 THE HOMESTEAD Cabernet-Shiraz

Variety - Cabernet Sauvignon (60%) and Shiraz (40%)
Origin - Barossa Valley

Vintage

The 2015 growing season started with plenty of soil moisture accumulated through winter to give the vines the best start possible. With strong growth of the vines and an average crop, things were looking set for an outstanding vintage in the Barossa. The grapes gradually accumulated plenty of sugar and flavour with the mild conditions. Due to the perfect condition of the vines the end of vintage finished with a flourish with the fruit obtaining the optimum ripeness quickly.

Vineyards

This wine is produced from fruit from both our Draycott and Olive Hill Shiraz vineyards. With a diversity of soils across the Burge Family Vineyard ranging from light sandy soils to loamy soils over clay and clay over limestone we can manipulate the blend to get the best possible wine. Further increasing complexity of the final blend.

Winemaking

All the fruit from the Burge Family Estate is hand-picked ensuring the fruit is in pristine condition when it reaches the winery. Each parcel from the Burge Family Estate vineyard is fermented in separate batches so different winemaking techniques can be employed to build complexity and depth of flavour. Wild fermentation has been encouraged, as well as extended time on skins. The wine was matured in a mix of new French and American hogsheads to complement the fruit and improve quality. The wine naturally clarified, so no bottling filtration was required. The wine was bottled after being in oak for 24 months.

Tasting Notes

This Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz is a medium to full red colour. The nose is expressive of blackcurrant, raspberry and sweet chocolate/toasty oak. This medium to full bodied, "perfect blend," is greater than the sum of its parts. The slightly more dominant Cab Sauv provides berry fruit and savoury complexity while the Shiraz completes the blend with juicy raspberry fruit. There is a perfectly balanced oak presence with toast, chocolate and cream the main attributes. Additional aged complexity appears on the mid palate combining with a creamy mouthfeel and velvety tannins. The wine finishes long with fruit and oak.

Ageing

This wine drinks well now or will age for up to five years with careful cellaring.

Food Pairing

Beef kababs, medium rare juicy steak or beef wellington.

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2017 Clochemerle Grenache - Shiraz - Mourvèdre

Variety – Grenache (52.5%), Shiraz (28.4%) and Mataro (19.1%)

Origin – Barossa Valley

Vintage

2017 was a dry and mild growing season. It began with good winter rains filling the soil profile and ensuring the vines had the best start. The ensuing growing season proved to be quite a cool and mild one by Barossa standards. The trick in 2017 was to let the grapes hang to accumulate character and flavour and not pick prematurely. It is a vintage of moderate alcohols but with lifted aromatics and bright fruit.

Vineyards

The soils at Burge Family Winery are generally sandy loam over clay. With an ancient riverbed near the front of the property the sandy soil has a good amount of river pebbles. As we move up Olive Hill the sandy top soil layer gives way to a pure clay soil. The sandy soils give great drainage and make the vines “work hard”, producing small berries/ low crops with great concentration of flavour and tannin structure, that make the vines long lived. The clay in the sub soil gives good moisture retention capabilities so the vines roots can “extract” the required amount of moisture as required.

Winemaking

All the fruit from the Burge Family Estate is hand-picked ensuring the fruit is in pristine condition when it reaches the winery. Each parcel from the Burge Family Estate vineyard are fermented in separate batches so different winemaking techniques can be employed to build complexity and depth of flavour. Wild fermentation has been encouraged, as well as extended time on skins. The wine was matured in a mix of American and French hogsheads. A careful blend selection was conducted to ensure that the perfect blend is created. The wine naturally clarified, so no bottling filtration was required. The wine was bottled after being in oak for 24 months.

Tasting Notes

SMG blends have found their niche in the Barossa Valley and are producing wines of outstanding quality. This SMG with Grenache (52.5%), Shiraz (28.4%) and Mataro (19.1%), exhibits what this blend is re known for, a lifted and fragrant nose, a medium bodied palate and soft approachable tannins. The fruit is rich and deep with cherry and plum, backed with alluring spice from the Grenache and an earthy complexity from the Mataro. The palate is elegant and approachable with rounded tannins and a hint of French oak spice. Drink now or over the next few years.

Ageing

This wine drinks well now or will age for up to five years with careful cellaring.

Food Pairing

Rogan Josh curry with side of spicy egg plant.

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2017 DRAYCOTT Cabernet Shiraz

Variety – Cabernet Sauvignon (60%), Shiraz (40%)

Origin – Barossa Valley

Tasting Notes

Blending Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz is quintessentially Australian, with each of the variety’s contribution its own unique qualities to the blend. This wine is a blend of Cab Sauv (60%) and Shiraz (40%). With a deep purple colour, the wine has lifted black fruits and sweet spice. The palate is rich, lush and full bodied with the power and concentration provided by the Shiraz, while the Cab Sauv provides the backbone and fine tannin structure. The palate is long and finished with velvety tannins and lashings of sweet fruit.

Ageing

This wine can age for up to twenty years with careful cellaring.

Food Pairing

Red meats and full flavoured cheeses.

Tasting Notes

Cabernet Sauvignon is perfectly suited to the red soils at Burge Family vineyards. This wine encapsulates everything that’s great about Barossa Cab Sauvignon with its deep red colour. With a lifted nose of berry and briary notes. The palate is medium to full bodied with blackcurrant, liquorice and Indian spice notes. The velvety tannins contribute to a rich and satisfying mouthfeel. With subtle use of oak and plenty of flavour the wine finishes satisfyingly long.

Ageing

This wine can age for up to twenty years with careful cellaring.

Food Pairing

Roast lamb.

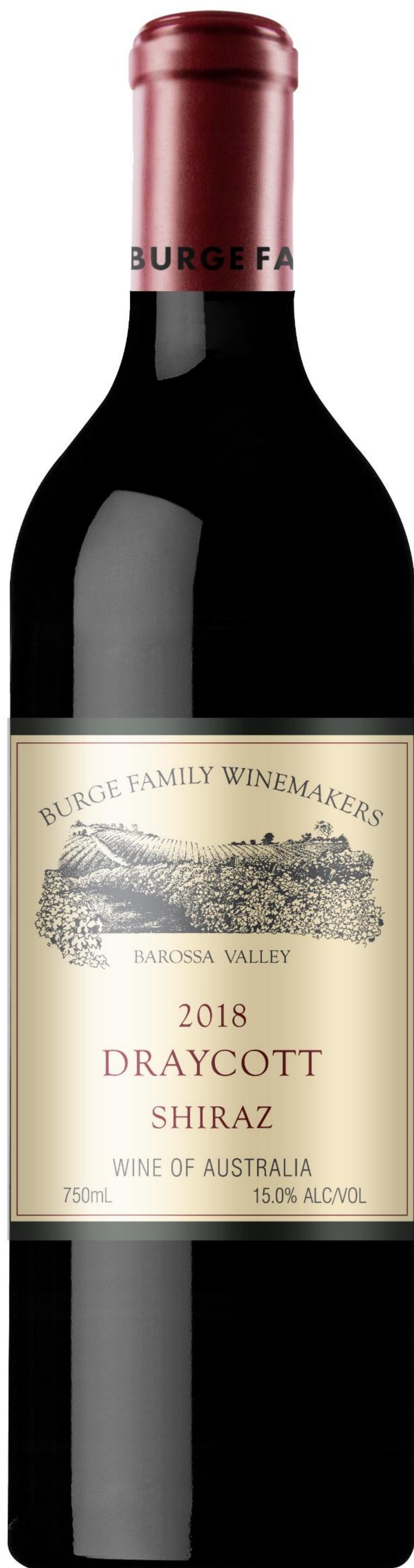

On the nose there is an abundance of character with plums and spice coming to the fore. The palate is filled with intense blackberry fruit, plums and creamy oak. There is great complexity and the berry fruit and spicy oak linger.

Ageing

This wine can age for up to twenty years with careful cellaring.

Beef and game, Korean BBQ or Chinese BBQ.

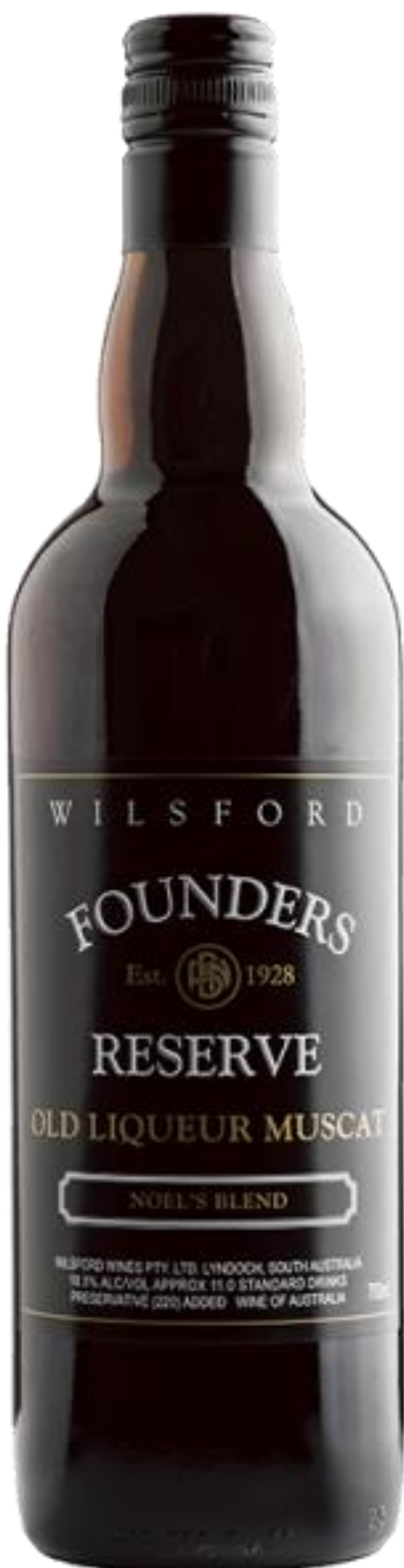

Origin - Barossa Valley

Percival Burge is the Third Generation of Burge Family Winemakers. He grew a high reputation for the quality of his wines. This port is based on Percival's Fortified Wine, which began in 1960. It is showing the characteristics 'rancio' flavours of a great quality aged Tawny and exhibits both balance and freshness. It has lusciousness, yet a 'clean' balanced, non-cloying finish.

Tasting Notes

.Wilsford Old Tawny has a deep tawny colour. On the nose, it shows complex nutty aromas combined with hints of honey and figs. On the palate, rich mature fruit flavours, beautifully mellowed with a luscious long finished. Full of burnt toffee, Xmas cake and raisin flavours
