Our Region

The Mornington Peninsula is a cool climate winegrowing region, influenced strongly by the weather patterns of the Great Southern Ocean.

The surrounding water and the cooling winds from the South, East and West combine to provide a climate ideal for growing Pinot Noir, Pinot Gris and Chardonnay.

Soils vary considerably and include the red volcanic soils of Red Hill, the sedimentary yellow duplex of Tuerong, brown duplex of Merricks and the sandier clay loam of Moorooduc.
