2020-21 LUXURY WINE RELEASE

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Established in 1890, Château Tanunda is the site of the Barossa's earliest vines as well as its first winery. An Icon of the Barossa, the Château is privately owned by the Geber family who continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

Château Tanunda, in their 130th Anniversary year presents the 2020 collection. These limited release wines are a collection of select single vineyard sites as well as old vine parcels from 50 to 160 years of age and are revered for their fine quality fruit and deep root structure bringing diversity of flavour and character.

Hand-crafted, minimalistic winemaking using small open fermenters, gentle basket pressing and aging in the finest oak, ensures the unique qualities of the vines are embodied in these wines. These rare and collectable wines have proven to cellar well. Highly sought after and with an international reputation they are only produced in exceptional vintages - but due to small quantities are always limited release.

OVERVIEW

Only the very best grapes are selected from individual vineyard blocks in exceptional vintages. Hand-picked, hand-sorted to 1 ton open fermenters with four times daily plunging and careful basket pressing. The highest quality parcels from this years fermented wines are set aside for maturation in the finest French and American oak. A barrel selection is made of only the finest wines to produce the pinnacle of that vintage – The Everest.

French oak. The wine is incredibly dense and focused with a richness and purity that simply exudes top class Barossa Shiraz. Rich dark chocolate, mocha and cedar spice are all to

the fore but the central core is highly focused

OLD VINE EXPRESSIONS 150 YEAR OLD VINES SEMILLON

2019

"These are believed to be some of the oldest Semillon vines in the world. The depth of flavour and complexity of the old vines is something that has made this wine extraordinary since its first release in 2012." - Chief Winemaker Neville Rowe

OVERVIEW

The Barossa is home to some of the world's oldest ungrafted Semillon vines and the grapes for this wine are from low yielding 'Barossa Ancestor Vines' planted more than 150 years ago. Only 11.9 hectares of vines over 150 years exist in the Barossa, representing 0.17% of the region's plantings. The grapes are hand-picked, hand-sorted and gently basket-pressed. After beginning fermentation in temperature controlled stainless steel, the wine is then matured in seasoned French oak barrels with regular lees stirring for seven months to enhance flavours and structure, whilst building flavour and complexity.

OLD VINE EXPRESSIONS 150 YEAR OLD VINES 1858 FIELD BLEND

2016

OVERVIEW

Planted before 1867 and back to pioneering beginnings of the Australian wine industry. There are less than 30 hectares of these ancestor vines in the Barossa. The best vineyards from this time provided the parent vines of varieties, which would go on to form the Australian vineyards of the future. The grapes are hand-picked and fermented in 1 ton open fermenters with regular hand-plunging. The wine is then gently basket pressed. It is bottled unfined and unfiltered. We have searched for an older field blend and to our knowledge this would be the oldest.

VINEYARD This small block in Springton in the Eden Valley is home to

classified 'Ancestor' vines, dry grown as bush vines on their original rootstock. The block yields 1 ton of grapes in the best of

vintages.

OLD VINE EXPRESSIONS 100 YEAR OLD VINES SHIRAZ

2017

OVERVIEW

The Barossa is home to some of the world's oldest ungrafted Shiraz vines. The vines were planted in a pre-mechanized and pre-irrigation era where site selection was everything. Dry grown as bush vines with only the best soils, vine material and sites surviving the first years, and only the absolute pinnacle surviving the 100 years thereafter. The low-yielding 'Centenarian' vines, noted for their intensity of flavour, were planted more than a century ago around the time construction of the Château itself began. The select parcels are hand-picked and fermented in small open fermenters with hand plunging four times daily before careful basket pressing to more gently extract tannin and colour.

Vale and the Nuriootpa sub-regions of the Barossa

MATURATION 24 Months - French and American Oak (20% New)

COLOUR Deep purple

TASTING NOTE The wine delivers classic regional characters of dense, spicy

blueberry fruit and savoury pan jus. Hints of liquorice, plum, and all-spice all delicately interwoven. A fine grained tannin structure and depth of flavour all show that this wine has

OVERVIEW

Planting in the 1960's was a time of innovation, new viticultural know-how and technology was opening up the possibility of new site selection. Barossa is home to some of the oldest continuously producing vineyards in the world. Over 175 year tradition of wine growing and phylloxera free. 50 year Old Shiraz Vines represent less than 4% of the regions plantings. The grapes were hand-picked, hand plunged in small open fermenters and carefully basket pressed before maturation.

OVERVIEW

50 year Old Cabernet Sauvignon Vines represents less than 2% of the region plantings. Our vineyard is from the heart of the Valley Floor in Bethany - where the first village was settled in the Barossa Valley and the first vines in the Barossa Valley were planted. The grapes are fermented in small open fermenters and basket pressed.

The Barossa has some of the oldest and diverse soil types in the world, contributing to what makes our wines unique. Discover the differences between Barossa's sub-regions. A journey through the Terroirs is a lesson in the Barossa's versatility. This is the 10th vintage of this wine from the Ebenezer District, an area famous for its elegantly structured style of Shiraz.

OVERVIEW

Terroir: The combined effects of site soil and climate on the vine. The Barossa has some very distinct sub-regions which exhibit their own unique influence on the wine. A journey through the Terroirs is a lesson in the Barossa's versatility. We have chosen Eden Valley to highlight its rich, darker flavours unique to this high altitude, cooler climate and rocky, clay loam soils.

THE CHÂTEAU SINGLE VINEYARD EDEN VALLEY CHARDONNAY

OVERVIEW

Hand-picked from select rows in our high altitude Eden Valley vineyard. The grapes are basket pressed (20% whole bunch), before the juice is run to barrel for fermentation. Wild and inoculated fermentation is encouraged. Regular lees stirring and 8 month's maturation in new and seasoned French oak barriques gives the wine beautiful texture and complexity.

OVERVIEW

Hand-picked from select rows of our 12 ha Vine Vale vineyard at 280 m elevation. Famous for its sandy loam soils, Shiraz from this vineyard is known for its elegance and fine structure. This single vineyard wine is basket pressed and matured in a fine selection of French oak for 18 months.

THE CHÂTEAU SINGLE VINEYARD BETHANIAN SHIRAZ

OVERVIEW

Bethany is one of the oldest settlements in the Barossa and is where the first vineyards in the Barossa Valley were planted in the 1840s. Bethanian Shiraz has been selected from a single vineyard planted in the 1960's. The South Para River provides a cooling effect with gully breezes, consequently the wine has a more red fruit profile and an elegance to the palate that defines the Bethany sub-region.

OVERVIEW

Our 76 acre single vineyard in the Eden Valley has higher-altitude and cooler conditions optimal for slower, longer ripening of fine Cabernet Sauvignon. Basket pressed, unfiltered with 18 months in superior quality French oak. We selected 32 rows in the best soil and positioning in this vineyard, each vine is hand-prunned in time honoured methods. This ensures vine health and flavours resulting in this delicious and quality Cabernet Sauvignon.
