This wine shows that tempranillo can be an excellent drinking young wine delivering excellent fruit flavours and persistent length and can also be cellared for the next 7 years.

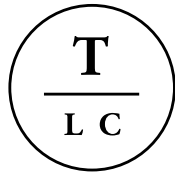

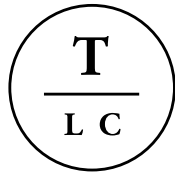

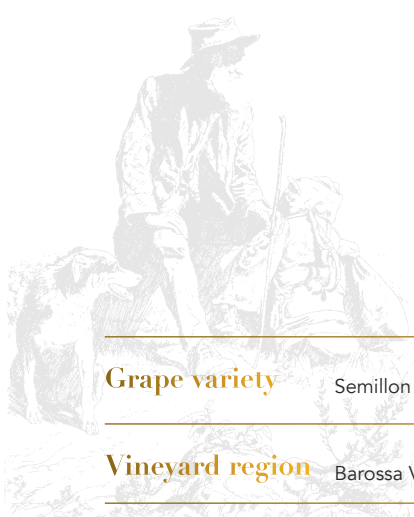

Vintage conditions Barossa has experienced a wetter than average winter and spring. This, combined with below average temperatures in December and January, will result in a later harvest than we've seen in many years. Harvest will be three to four weeks later than in recent years, which is 'back to normal'. Growers will start picking Barossa's 'hero' red variety, Shiraz, in early-mid March 2017 (whereas the first pick of Shiraz has been early-mid February for many of the past 12-13 years). With the good soil moisture and cooler temperatures to date, the vines are looking very healthy - and a later harvest date means the grapes will ripen more slowly, enabling a gradual accumulation of sugars and flavours, which is exactly what Barossa winemakers are looking for to produce high quality Barossa wines. Most Barossa Valley white varieties are just days away from harvest, with BV Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon just through veraison at this stage, so possibly 3-4 weeks from harvest. Eden Valley harvest will follow this. Fortunately in Barossa, summer rains are usually followed by windy conditions, so the 30-40mm of rain the region experienced from 4-6 February dried off quickly, enabling the vines to remain generally disease-free and healthy. Additionally, the soils have been topped-up with some lovely moisture to keep the canopies going throughout the summer ripening season. Last week's hot weather of four days in a row of 37-plus degrees Celsius helped dry out any berries split due to the rain. Barossa wine grape yields are looking about average to slightly above average depending on variety, where vineyards are located, and viticultural techniques employed by the grower.

Colour White

Nose Through careful nurturing the wine alludes a softness and complexity from the nose to the palate, a flavour that is enveloped in a soft buttery mouth feel.

Palate Hints of burnt apricot on the front palate and thyme through the back palate combines with a delicate layering of lanolin, lemon grass and poached pear ensconced in brioche that creates a complexity, when combined with a melange of spices: cinnamon, clove and allspice on the nose, LWE Semillon is at once alluring and intoxicating.

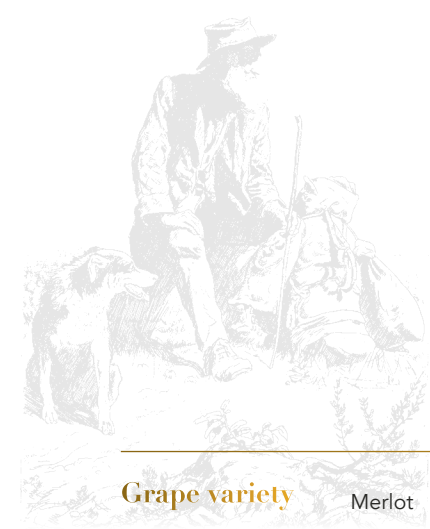

As you swirl the wine it eddies in the glass showing a vibrant colour scheme of royal purple and crimson; from the glass waft aromas of cassis, violets and plum with a flutter of crushed juniper.

Palate Our LWE Merlot stands proud to showcase what this noble grape perfectly encapsulates, a palate of coffee, toffee and black and blue berries with undertones of fresh cigar box with delicate lifted tones of rosemary and cassis. Deep rich alluring expression of Merlot. The palate is a revelation of rollicking rolling flavours of blueberry, fruit cake and spice.

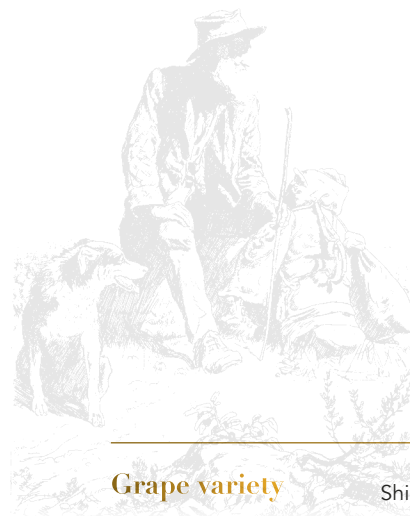

Nose	The wine taints the glass with the colours of the Barossa in summer and autumn, golden hues, with deep colours of burnt apricot and ochre. The nose is intoxicating that you are drawn to smell deeper, to draw in all the nuanced complexity of the wine without thinking.
Palate	The nose is lifted with orange marmalade, malt toffee and caramel. The first sip is when the full complexity of the wine hits you; at once you taste hints of chestnuts, with traces of walnuts, raisins and rich-caramel flavours. The natural acidity allows the wines to be sweet on entry, but be dry on the finish so it does not cloy.
