

2020 'The Vincent' Survivor Vine Grenache



Eau de Frambois fills the glass when first poured, before lazy swirling encourages a more carnal expression - damp earth, marinated sirloin, North African spice and wintergreen aromatics fill the nose-scape.

When first opened, the wine tugs at its leash, scurries with the youthful enthusiasm of a full-bladdered pup in a backyard full of saplings. The kinetic energy is palpable. Acid drive, which feels tethered to the chassis rather than added-on, hastens the drive through the mouth. Playful, perfumed and so very drinkable, but as the wine breathes up, a richer spectrum of fruit asserts itself, plums and raspberries to the fore, separating it stylistically from the perfumed sand-derived fineness of the 1850. Unbelievable value for a wine that is both playful and deadly serious.

This Grenache is produced from two 100+ year old vineyards from the renowned Barossa Valley.

The Vincent offers inviting aromas of rich fruit and white pepper. The palate is generous with intense true varietal characteristics. It's delicately rounded and generous. The mouth feel denotes the 90-year-old Foudre barrels, where this wine has rested for 12 months. A superb Grenache that has a lingering finish. A wine that can be enjoyed now, or well into the future.
