Urban Prof Chardonnay 2023

This small batch Margaret River chardonnay displays a lifted bouquet of nectarines, grapefruit and brioche dough. Wild fermentation delivers a light flinty note, while fine French oak maturation and extended time on lees provide complexity and mid palate richness to the wine, retaining precision and impressive length. Produced in extremely small quantities, this wine is a reflection of both site and season.

8th Deadly Zin 2015

Violets and lifted raspberry fruit on the nose with hints of sour plum and stewed forest fruit. Aniseed and/or Chinese 5 spice with some toasty oak notes. The palate is rich and lush with dark forest fruits, some Christmas cake and raisins tied together with a bright acidity and framed by toasty, slightly vanillin oak.
