



The Yangarra Estate philosophy centers on producing wines solely from our single-vineyard estate in the McLaren Vale region of South Australia, where bush-vine Grenache is the keystone variety.

Yangarra Estate's history begins in 1946, when the property was called Lalla Rookh – or “love nest”. That year, Bernard Smart, who still lives on the Yangarra property today with his wife, helped his father plant the unirrigated bush-vine Grenache of the High Sands Vineyard. That vineyard would be the start of a long history of providing the fruit for some of Australia's most acclaimed wines.

Today, the Yangarra Estate is a biodynamic winery and farm with a strong commitment to stewarding the land for generations to come. Yangarra's combination of rare geologies, moderate altitude, abundant sunshine and cool



evening breezes make it perfect for growing Rhone varieties. Yangarra produces two limited production white wines, Roussanne and Viognier, and specializes in the production of Mourvedre, Shiraz, and Grenache. Every Yangarra Estate wine is a confident reflection of the nature of this land.
