In 2019 Duxton Vineyards acquired the historic Stanley Winery, Australia's fifth largest winery, providing Duxton Vineyards with control of its supply chain from nursery to tank. Our energetic and innovative viticultural and winemaking teams strive to make great wines with minimal intervention. Our owned brands include Pete's Pure and Brave to be Murray, with many private label and bulk wine opportunities.

STORY

An Icon of the Barossa Valley, the story of Kaesler is one of old roots by German settlers and new investment in the booming late twentieth century wine trade. The first Kaesler family vineyards date back to the 1890s including the shiraz vines that form the core of today's old vine offerings. Current day Kaesler has grown under owner and winemaker, Reid Bosward. The custodians of Kaesler, winemakers Bosward and Stephen Dew along with head Viticulturist Nigel van der Zande believe in the concept of regenerative farming to improve the ancestral vineyards. Estate grown and made, their wines represent the pinnacle of Kaesler Shiraz from old vines and deep Barossa roots.

WINERY


Surrounding the Kaesler winery is 28 hectares of vineyards. The average age of the Vineyard is in excess of 50 years, and all predate modern mechanization. Because of this, all fruit is hand harvested and pruned by hand using traditional methods. Kaesler also owns 9.21 hectares (22.8 acres) of vineyards in the Barossa sub region, Marananga. This area is on the western side of the region about 10 minutes' drive from the Kaesler winery.

VITILCULTURE

Nigel van der Zande takes the modern approach to sustainable farming, in that soil health is paramount; with regular monitoring and pursuit of natural means of soil care and protection. Estateproduced and local compost is used in the vineyards in combination with natural enhancers and mulch. Kaesler showcases what the Barossa does best and can do in the right hands. More than 70% of the red wines produced by Kaesler are made from vines more than 50 years old.



All Stonehorse wines are vilified at the Kaesler winery in the Barossa Valley.




Clare Valley is recognized as one of the finest growing regions for riesling in all of Australia.

In a short time Kaesler has become one of the greatest names in old vine wines from the Barossa. Reid specialises in single vineyard harvests that produce the magnificent reds that can hold their heads high among the very best.

VITILCULTURE

The vineyards were carefully selected due to their unique soil formations and the microclimates found in the respective vineyards. The vineyards are over 40 years old, in the blue-ribbon subregions of Watervale and Polish Hill River. Polish Hill vineyard is a 30 acre (12 ha) block in which Clare Wine Co's Riesling excels.

STORY

Yarra Yering is one of the oldest and most beautiful vineyards in Victoria's Yarra Valley with 28 hectares of vines located at the foot of the Warramate Hills. Established in 1969 by Dr Bailey Carrodus, the 1973 vintage saw production of the first vintage of Dry Red Wine No. 1 and Dry Red Wine No. 2.

WINERY

Yarra Yering has recently experienced great success, taking out the 2022 Halliday Wine Companion Winery of the Year and the 2021 The Real Review Top Wineries Australia.

The 70 acres of vines at Yarra Yering are grown without irrigation on a northerly slope at the foot of the Warramate hills. Good drainage, all day exposure to the sun, and enough elevation from the valley floor to avoid the spring frosts produces wines that are inherently balanced, precise and elegant.

WINEMAKER

Sarah joined the team at Yarra Yering in September 2013 as Winemaker, giving the individual blocks and varieties the time and attention, they deserve.

In August, 2016 Sarah was awarded one of the wine industry's highest honours, being named by James Halliday as Winemaker of the Year for 2017 at the QANTAS epiQure Halliday Wine Companion Awards. More recently, Sarah was crowned **Gourmet Traveller Wine 2021** Winemaker of the Year. Now at the helm of one of the Yarra Valley's best wineries, Sarah will continue the tradition that Dr Bailey Carrodus started in 1969 with the first vineyard plantings at Yarra Yering.

VITILCULTURE

Yarra Yering has not stood still, the endeavor to produce better wines is pursued constantly in the winery and vineyard, maintaining its status as one of the best in the Yarra Valley. The yield is low, 1-2 tons per acre, resulting in fruit with great intensity and concentration of flavour and with an abundance of natural acidity. Hand-pruning is undertaken over winter by the vineyard staff, regardless of the weather in the Yarra Valley. As the vineyard has grown in size from the original 30 acre block to the current 70 acres, new varieties have been planted to supplement

SARAH CROWE

Sarah's wine career began in the Hunter Valley as Assistant Winemaker for the brokenwood winery. Over the next 12 years she worked harvests all over the world until a desire for a new challenge brought her to the cool climate of the Yarra Valley.

Sarah joined the team at Yarra Yering in September 2013 as Winemaker and is excited to be focusing on a single iconic vineyard site and giving the individual blocks and varieties the time and attention they deserve.

In August, 2016 Sarah was awarded one of the wine industry's highest honours, being named by James Halliday as Winemaker of the Year for 2017. This for the 2014 vintage of Yarra Yering, her first at the winery!

Now serving as GM and Winemaker of one of the Yarra Valley's best wineries, Sarah will continue the tradition that Dr Bailey Carrodus started in 1969 with the first vineyard plantings at Yarra Yering.

2021 saw Yarra Yering receive the distinction of Winemaker of the Year, Winery of the Year and Wine of the Year - a feat that has never been achieved by any Australian winemaker before.






