



Golden Amrita:

Golden Amrita is a family owned company owned by the Liu family that for many generations has produced the premium quality aged Pu'er vintage teas in Yunnan province in Southern China. Amrita is an ancient Indian word meaning "Nectar of the Gods", a drink that bestowed immortality. In 2017 the family purchased a small estate vineyard situated in the highly acclaimed Greenock sub-region of the Barossa Valley.

The Vineyard:

This single estate vineyard is planted solely with Shiraz. The Greenock sub region of the Barossa is especially suited to making rich, full flavoured Shiraz. The vineyard is expertly managed for Golden Amrita by a sixth-generation family of Barossa vignerons, the Kalleske family. Average vine age is over 20 years and the vines are at an ideal age for the production of high-quality Shiraz. The vineyard has ideal soils for viticulture with red/brown loam over red clay and layers of limestone. This low yielding site produced in 2019 only 4tons/ha (26hl/ha) of small bunched, highly flavoured Shiraz grapes.

Winemaking:

Winemaking is overseen by Kym Milne MW, our chief winemaker. Different sections of the vineyard are selected depending on quality, and each batch fermented separately in small open fermenters. The wine is then basket pressed and aged in the finest new and one year old French and American oak barrels for 18 months.

Tasting Note:

A full bodied and richly textured Shiraz, with vibrant blackberry and mulberry fruit characters combining with sweet oak nuances in a smooth, rich and well structured palate and finishing with ripe, lingering soft tannins. Whilst drinking well as a young wine this classic Single Estate Shiraz will reward careful long term cellaring.
