This wine is named after the first fleet brigantine “Rapid” on which Colonel Light arrived in South Australia in 1836. Those who sailed from England aboard the Rapid, among them William Jacob, referred to him as “Captain Light” because he was Captain for its voyage from London to South Australia.

Nose	The primary flavours are blueberry and boysenberry with a hint of liquorice
Palate	Fresh and lively, complete, followed by spice and smoky finish.

Colonel William Light, founder of Adelaide and first Surveyor-General of South Australia, traversed our estate on 13th December 1837, when exploring the north-east of Adelaide. On this historic occasion, he named our town Lyndoch and the surrounding hills Barossa. The Barossa Colonel Light Monument, a life-size bronze statue of Colonel Light on horseback, and the iconic Barossa Manor commemorate the birthplace of the world-famous Barossa wine region on our estate. Generations of our winemakers have dedicated their work to this grand tradition, embodying our heritage of outstanding winemaking in every bottle.

This wine is named in honour of William Light's partner Maria Gandy. They met in 1832 and travelled together to South Australia in 1836. Maria became one of Adelaide's founding females and was the true first lady of Adelaide. The Maria Gandy Bicentennial Memorial in Thebarton, Adelaide is dedicated to her lifetime achievements.

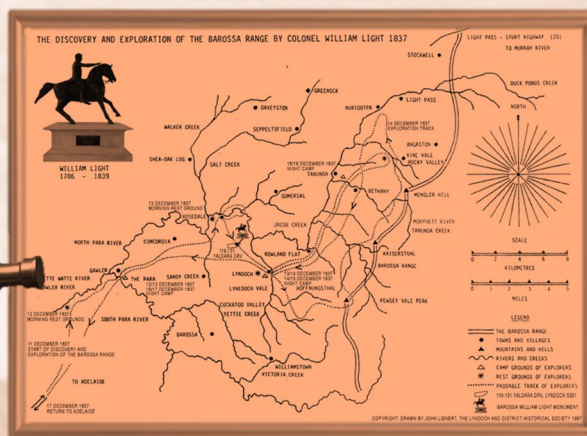

This wine is named after the explorer way of Colonel Light when naming the Barossa Range and Lyndoch in December 1837, which was later researched by the Lyndoch & District Historical Society and subsequently led to the erection of the Barossa Colonel Light Monument on our estate.

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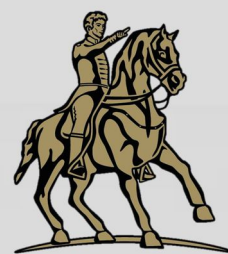

In 1860 he was the first resident South Australian to be knighted.

This wine is named after William Jacob who arrived in Australia together with Colonel Light on the First Fleet brigantine Rapid in 1836 and later became his associate. William planted his first vines in 1854 in the Barossa which made him a founder of the world-famous wine region.

Colour	Deep red, dark core
Nose	This grand wine has complex flavours of blackcurrant, capsicum and herbaceous minty notes. Cedar and lavender incense waft in the background.
Palate	Fine, silky tannins and richly concentrated flavours are in perfect harmony. The sheer volume of fruit giving tremendous depth and length of flavour

Colour	Deep dark red with purple on rim
Nose	A rare release premium wine in which the absorbed oak allows the single block Barossa fruits to weave their magic.
Palate	Elegant, yet bold with voluminous tannins, which assist a silky call-out and provide mid-palate expansion the overall persistent and long velvety finish.

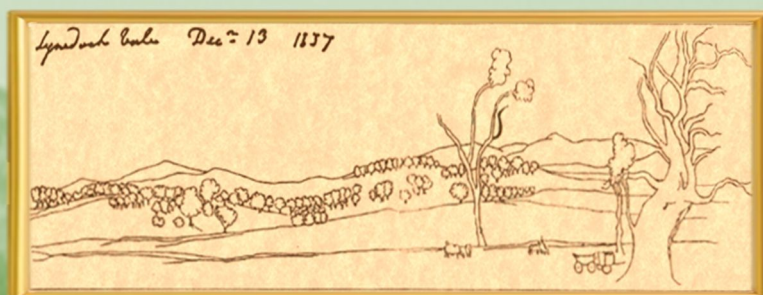

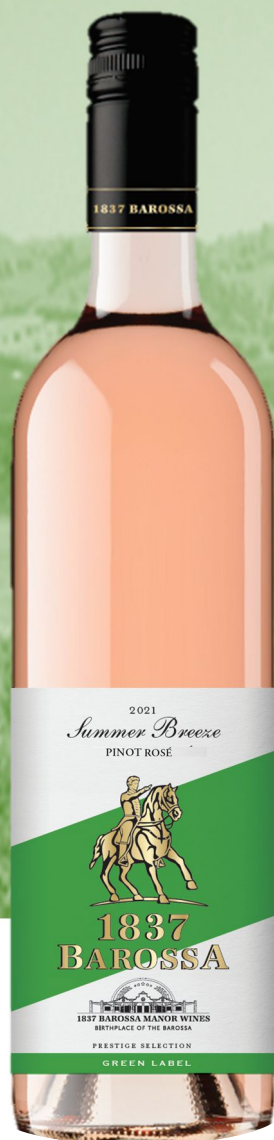

*Summer Breeze*  
PINOT ROSÉ



This wine is named after the summer breeze when Col. Light traversed our estate on a summer day on Dec. 13th 1837 at about 5pm reminding him of Barrosa in Spain, when naming our valley Lyndoch and the hill range Barossa. Among the exploration party was James Hurtle Fisher who later became first Mayor of Adelaide.

Colour	A brilliant deep pink
Nose	This refreshing Eden Valley Rose made of Pinot Noir and Pinot Grigio rewards with perfumed notes of white jasmine and lemon verbena woven throughout layers of juicy grapefruit and crisp green apple.
Palate	Earthy, yet elegant wine, cool, crisp and dry with an attractively fresh finish
Aging	Enjoy now or cellar for a few years
Food pairing	Best served with freshly shucked oysters, but does delights on its own.

This wine is named after the stormy romance between William Light and his second wife Mary Bennet, the beautiful and wealthy 19-year-old illegitimate daughter of the Duke of Richmond. They met in the London studio of the miniature painter Charlotte Jones and they married on 16th October 1824.

Colour	Pale light yellow
Nose	A handcrafted Eden Valley Pinot Gris gently pressed and aged on fine lees for 5 months rewards with aromas of pears and apples and nuances of spice.
Palate	It is dry and smooth on the palate with a very pleasant finish
Aging	Enjoy now or cellar for a few years
Food pairing	Best served with light dishes, especially fried mushrooms and fresh water fish.

This wine is named after the sister of Colonel Light, Mary. He formed sweet memories of India and its spices when attending her wedding to the indigo plantation owner George Boyd in Calcutta in March 1805. Light remained in India until November 1806 before returning to Europe.

Colour	Deep yellow
Nose	This aromatic sweet Eden Valley Riesling offers primary fruit aromas of nectarine, honeycrisp apple and pear.
Palate	With distinct regional characteristics, it delivers a sweet balanced and lingering palate
Aging	Enjoy now or cellar for some good years
Food pairing	Best served with spicy food, such as strong Indian and Asian spiced dishes

SAUVIGNON BLANC



This wine is named after the flavours of the tropical fruits of Kuala Kedah, South East Asia, now Malaysia, where Colonel Light was born in 1786. He was the second child and first son of Captain Francis Light and Martinha Rozells, who was of presumed Portuguese and Malay descent.

Colour	Pale straw
Nose	This fine Eden Valley Sauvignon Blanc displays aromas of tropical stone fruits and passionfruit giving way to mango, guava, nectarine and just a hint of dried herb.
Palate	Crisp, refreshing and detailed on the palate, the vibrant acid line is tamed by the generosity culminating in a long, pristine finish.
Aging	Enjoy now or cellar for some good years
Food pairing	Best served with fresh seafood, Asian dishes and goat cheese

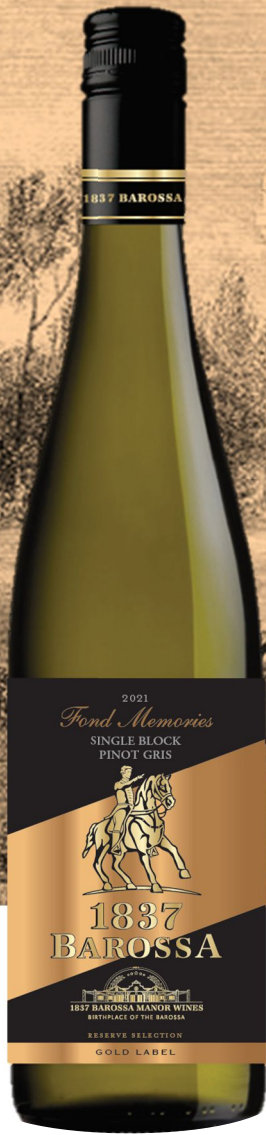

PINOT GRIS



This wine is named after Col. Light's fond memories of George Doughty, Sheriff of Suffolk in England and his wife Anne Goodwin who educated William Light in his young years from 1793-1799. He became attached to the Doughtys and later named his house in Adelaide after their family home Theberton Hall in Suffolk.

Colour	Light golden yellow
Nose	This premium Eden Valley wine displays aromas of white peach and pear with hints of white nectarine.
Palate	The palate exhibits vibrant citrus flavours with a mid-palate of stone fruits and almond, finishing clean and crisp.
Aging	Enjoy now or cellar up 2-10 years
Food pairing	Best served with white meats and seafood particularly in meals that include a fruit element such as lemons.

Nose	This reserve sparkling wine celebrates a subtle, creamy style, backed by wonderfully nuanced aromas from premium Eden Valley Pinot Noir fruit, in perfect unison, note by note.
Palate	Here the worlds of sensual pleasure and complexity collide, embodied in the intensity of Pinot Noir. Delicate bubbles and sustained mousse.
Aging	Enjoy now or cellar up 2-10 years
Food pairing	Best served with antipasti such as cheeses, olives and cured meats, quiches and pies.
