


Orange NSW - Since 1815 -







ESTABLISHED 1815

The history of Mayfield dates back to 1815 when explorer, William Charles Wentworth, was granted Mayfield as a thank you for his earlier crossing of the blue mountains.

Since the Eastham family purchased the Mayfield Vineyard in 2021, the commitment to producing the region's best wines has been renewed. Driven by viticulturist and coowner Charles Simons, a great deal of work has been conducted in the vineyard to ensure the new wines reflect the unique qualities of this historic property.






FAMILY OWNED

The Eastham Family acquired Mayfield in 2021, and a few months later also purchase the previously sold western lot and reunite it to Mayfield, increasing the property to 91 hectares.


The historic property also boasts a range of luxury accommodation, including the historic Mayfield Homestead and idyllic 'Old Schoolhouse' Cellar Door.





ORANGE WINE REGION

The key to Orange rapid success (the first commercial vines were only planted in 1980) is its multi-faceted terroir. The Orange Wine Region has a footprint which covers the City of Orange and parts of the surrounding Cabonne and Blayney Shires, its limit uniquely defined by elevation with 600 metres the lower limit. The Region's highest vineyards top a chilly 1000 metres. These high altitudes dramatically affect the climate of Orange with warm (but rarely hot) summer days yet cool nights, cold, frosty winters and occasional snow.





VINEYARDS

The Mayfield Vineyard was planted in 1999. Located on the eastern slopes of the ancient and extinct volcano, Mount Canobolas, we have 17 hectares of vines that sit at an elevation of 880 to 950 metres above sea level.

Our varieties include Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Sauvignon Blanc, Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon and Riesling.






VITICULTURIST - CHARLES SIMONS
