The unknown has shaped us into who we are today. It's our driving force. Our silent partner. The secret of our success.

When you hear the story of Yalumba. It is truly a story of magnificent unknowns.

And it's been this way from the very beginning. From 1847 when Samuel Smith and his family left their hometown of Wareham in Dorset, England on a ship named China and ventured to Adelaide. It was the new world, full of danger and intrigue. He could not resist.



THE STORY OF YALUMBA

Samuel headed into the unknown again when he founded Yalumba in 1849 by planting the first vine under the mystery of moonlight with his son, Sidney. He did not know in his mind what would become of that cutting, but in his heart he knew he was planting a legacy.

Next, he boldly ventured into Australia's goldfields and was rewarded with enough riches to cement Yalumba's place in the world. He purchased 80 acres of land and used it to prosper and set the catalyst for a long lineage of generations that would share his ideals.

Take Fred Caley Smith—Samuel's grandson for instance, bravely voyaging in 1893 across the entire globe gathering unheard of techniques and learnings from horticulturists around the world. Each one a cornerstone of Yalumba's future efforts.

In 1962, Yalumba started something truly magnificent with the creation of what can only be described as the essence—the heartbeat—of Yalumba. Now aptly named The Signature, it's a prized Cabernet Sauvignon & Shiraz blend and only released if the vintage is of a standard deemed worthy of the Yalumba name. Yes, it's fair to say the unknown flows through our very blood. Through Robert Hill-Smith, who—in 1985—took the reins as the leader of Yalumba at 34 years of age. A pioneer in his own right, he constantly innovates and challenges the norm, insisting on growing varietals matched to the terroir. He continues to encourage experimentation amongst the winemakers and champion the Yalumba Nursery; the manifestation of our progressive nature, dedication to sustainability and love for the Barossa.

Most recently, to honour the legend of Fred Caley Smith, we released Yalumba's most impressive wine in our 170-year history – The Caley Cabernet Sauvignon & Shiraz. A masterpiece in its own right and example of our commitment to the 'Great Australian Red'.

But perhaps our most powerful source of unknown goes largely unnoticed. It was here long before us and will be here long after we're gone. It is the Yalumba land—the very reason we're able to channel the power of possibility, like embracing wild fermentation and it is yet to reveal all its wonder. Which means there's one thing we do know - there's plenty more magnificent unknown to come.

Five generations, embracing the magnificent unknown



1812-1889

Samuel Smith

Samuel Smith is heralded with recognising the need to keep winemaking and grape growing separate industries. He pioneered the distribution of vine cuttings to farmers, encouraging them to plant and cultivate the vines.



Sidney Smith

Sidney Smith had a broad view of life and his vast experiences gave him a wide tolerance that, with his life-long practice of the winemaker's craft, fitted him admirably to preside over an established but still growing industry.



Walter Smith

Walter Smith was known as one of Yalumba's greatest promoters who oversaw the construction of a new Yalumba winery in 1903. capable of making more than one million litres of wine. He was a tireless wine industry advocate, campaigning against the threat of prohibition in the early 1920s and leading the company through the early challenging years of the Great Depression.



1909-1990

Wyndham Hill-Smith

Wyndham Hill-Smith was a jackof-all-trades in the Yalumba family. After a succesful cricketing career, including opening for Don Bradman, 'Windy' was a valued member of various industry associations and boards, and also re-branded the 1962 Galway Reserve Claret as The Signature Reserve, bearing our founder's name and beginning a legacy that still stands today.





Robert Hill-Smith

Robert Hill-Smith, at 34 years of age, led Yalumba into the modern era by cementing our reputation as an internationally-focused. inspired and envied business within the industry. He pioneered Viognier in Australia, launched Yalumba's most prestigious wine-The Caley Cabernet Sauvignon & Shiraz, honouring his great uncle Fred Caley Smith-and established Australia's First Families of Wine.

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The Clocktower

The Clocktower

HONOURING TRADITION IS ESSENTIAL WHEN TRAILBLAZING TOWARDS THE FUTURE.

With the startings of something truly magnificent in motion, Sidney Smith decided it was time to commit to the Barossa and literally cement Yalumba's place in it. Sidney's vision was a long-term one. In his mind, such a grand building should withstand the test of time and be sustainable. After all, Yalumba means 'all the land around' and the clocktower was intended as a physical dedication to the land in which it sits.

Led by sons Walter and Percy and built by renowned clockmakers Gillett & Johnston, the family commissioned Adelaide architects, Edward Davies & Rutt—as well as stonemasons and blue marble from local quarries—to create Yalumba's iconic clocktower. Standing two stories tall and 155 feet long, it houses an enormous 5-foot clock with a presence that's undeniable. More than 100 years after Sidney, Walter and Percy celebrated the clocktower's opening, we continue to ensure their long-term vision extends well into the future.

The current façade encloses the original sections of the building dating back to 1870, with only a couple of additions over the years. The most incredible thing is, the building has no foundations in the modern sense; the whole structure rests on a base of naturally occurring limestone.

The Cooperage

The Cooperage

FROM TRUE PASSION AND CRAFTSMANSHIP, GOOD THINGS COME.

The art of barrel making is an important part of Yalumba's history. Coopering continues to be a proud tradition at the winery since the swing of the first hammer before the turn of the 20th century.

While the precise inception of the Yalumba Cooperage remains a mystery lost in time, a photograph of a cooper circa 1890 serves as our earliest record. However, it's likely coopering was happening at Yalumba before then. The Cooperage, where it stands now, was built in 1951 for wine storage but it wasn't until the 1990s that the coopers moved in. Prior to this, they carried out their craft in various locations around the winery.

With an emphasis on crafting bespoke barrels from the ground up, Yalumba is the only winery in the Southern Hemisphere to have a truly operational on-site cooperage. passion and craftsmanship always result in something good

The Nursery

AT THE FOREFRONT OF INNOVATION IS WHERE GREATNESS LIVES.

With growth and prosperity in a new uncharted land in mind, Samuel Smith established Yalumba's first vine nursery in the 1950s. His intention to propagate quality stock and maintain his vineyard was only the beginning. He could never have predicted how important and iconic the Yalumba Nursery would become.

Success with propagating saw Samuel bestowed with a portion of Spanish, German and French vine material, first entrusted to the colony of South Australia in the 1830s. A nursery, supplying the ever-growing Barossa region, followed in 1982 and continues to this day.

With a focus on the land's natural terroir and identifying each clone's efficiency to flourish in it, we've positioned ourselves at the forefront of quality assurance research in vine health.

This allows us to continue being environmentally responsible winemakers with unprecedented access

to the highest quality sustainable planting material available in the country. Plus, we've created a unique opportunity to evaluate new or emerging varieties and clones before they are released commercially, positioning Yalumba as a leader in wine innovation globally.

Today, the Yalumba Nursery is an accredited stateof-the-art facility and supplier, servicing the wider Australian wine industry from vineyard planning to young vine management.

Our wines are made with the least intervention—but as much knowledge, confidence and expertise—as possible. We want our wines to show their provenance and natural appellation – whether it be a single site, a variety or a blend.

We are not afraid to push the boundaries and experiment to improve the quality of the wines. Curiosity is encouraged throughout all aspects of the business and isn't limited to winemaking.

We make our wines to be delicious, savoury and perfect partners with food and all occasions. They should have texture, interest and balance, and be a bit edgy. We want to excite and challenge the drinker; evolve with them and take them on a journey with every glass and every bottle.

Sustainability


BY DEFINITION, SUSTAINABILITY NEVER ENDS. IT'S INTEGRAL TO SUCCESS.

Generation after generation, we continually strive to reduce our impact on the environment, stay involved in our community and make great wine with minimal intervention.

We want to do the right thing and work with nature. We're committed to sustainable practices and believe this produces better wines. Our winemaking philosophy is to create wines with the least intervention possible.

Our "Commitment to Sustainable Winemaking" is based on the principals ISO9001 and ISO14001, and is regularly audited. Our best practice sustainability program has been internationally recognised and awarded as world-class and it's a philosophy that goes beyond winemaking, encompassing all aspects of the business. Day-to-day, we live and breathe sustainable practices.

Achieving ISO14001 certification remains a big deal to us. Being accredited with this international audit standard validates that we are doing the right thing.

Future vision

Climate change is a genuine threat to our industry's future and, as such, our teams are constantly experimenting with irrigation regimes with water preservation in mind. A current example is an irrigation trial that emulates the anticipated conditions of climate change in order to develop appropriate innovations and techniques that will ensure our vines continue to thrive and prosper during harsh conditions.

We'll continue to pave the way in viticultural techniques with multiple vineyard, clone and irrigation trials each year.

Sustainability achievements

- In 2016, Yalumba installed the largest solar system in an Australian winery (which will generate approximately 20% of all power required on-site).
- The 2009 restoration of the Yalumba Signature Cellar and Tanks 11 & 12 has been described by the Australian Institute of Architects as '...existing fabric and new work has been clearly defined with minimal intrusions, emphasising the beauty of the worn building fabric. It is a graceful way of "re-loving", reusing and recycling redundant material.'
- We were the first Australian winery awarded the Greenhouse Challenge Plus Leadership status in 2005.
- We were the first winery to receive a Climate Protection Award from the US Environmental Protection Agency in 2007.

Globally we've been awarded 43 accolades for our sustainable practices, including:

- International Award of Excellence for Sustainable Winegrowing (2013)
- International Green Apple GOLD Award, UK (2011)
- US Environmental Protection Agency Climate Protection Award (2007)
 – a first in the world wine industry
- Greenhouse Challenge Plus Leadership Status (2005) – a first for an Australian company.

We've been making organic wine since 2005 and, with increasing resources of Australian certified organic grapes, we can now make these wines more widely available.

The current collection—featuring Shiraz, Chardonnay, Viognier and Pinot Grigio—captures four individual wines that recognise our ongoing commitment to environmental management. However, we don't limit our efforts with biodynamic and organic grape growing and winemaking to this collection; the theories and practices are evident across all our estate vineyards and the winery.

Being harmonious with the natural environment is at the core of our certified organic winemaking, where our focus is on making delicious wine that can be enjoyed by everyone.

Yalumba is an industry leader in environmental performance; reducing carbon emissions, increasing biodiversity and exploring organic viticulture.





Vegan-friendly

CREATING WINES OF DISTINCTION TO BE ENJOYED BY EVERYONE.

Achieving 100% vegan-friendly wine status came from the desire to make more expressive and delicious wines. We strive to make only the best wines that speak and taste of provenance and natural appellation. They have texture, interest and balance. They excite, challenge and represent quality.

The decision to move away from using animal products such as gelatin, milk, and eggs in the making of our wines was initially made to avoid their tendency to strip away the delectable fruit flavours and textures we work so hard to gain. Through this, we ultimately found ourselves making better wines. But that's not the only reason we do it. Everyone should be able to enjoy quality wine, no matter their dietary requirements.



SETTING THE STANDARD FOR PREMIUM WINE AND MAKING IT KNOWN.

In Australia, there's no definition to prescribe what constitutes an 'old vine'. This means it's left open to interpretation and misleading claims. The Yalumba Old Vine Charter is dedicated to the recognition, preservation and promotion of old vines.

It's important to establish that while vine age may often be used as an indicator of quality, it is not a prerequisite. Just as variety, region or winemaker does not, by themselves, create a superior wine.

For us this means, from 2007 onward, vintages that refer to 'Old Vine' on any labels or in supporting documents and descriptions, will comply with the Yalumba Old Vine Charter.



The Octavius

The Octavius has evolved. It is still a serious Barossa wine, but now we see a modern interpretation. It's a wine of style and presence and not just about ripe dark fruit with lashings of oak. It's a wine of purity and balance, where the fruit flavours are supported by the judicious oak selection.

Unique to Yalumba are the 100-litre octaves made specifically for the old vine Barossa Shiraz, appropriately named The Octavius. The term 'octave' was coined by early coopers to describe a barrel an eighth of the size of a standard cask.


The Signature

Encompassing everything the Yalumba family stands for and the perfect representation of our history and ethos, The Signature is the go-to, premium Barossa red.

First vintage release was in 1962 and since the early '70s, The Signature has always been a Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz blend. It is a wine made to be cellared for many years. In 1966, Australian Prime Minister Sir Robert Menzies announced at the annual Adelaide Stock Exchange Dinner that the Yalumba 1961 Galway Vintage Reserve Special Claret was "the best red wine he had ever tasted" and suggested everyone raise their glasses to this fine achievement. This was the sort of acknowledgement that Windy Hill-Smith wasn't about to let fall on deaf ears, so he decided to rebadge the subsequent 1962 Galway Reserve Claret as The Signature Reserve, bearing the name of founder Samuel Smith. Since then, the 'sentimental favourite' has acknowledged the contribution of more than 56 signatories.







In 1974, Yalumba released one of its best Cabernet Shiraz ever. A 'freak' of vintage, it was unceremoniously stamped FDR1A – for Fine Dry Red and the bin code number 1A. Throughout all the gold rushes, revolutions and digital transformations, there has been one constant in Australian wine – Yalumba's Fortified Collection.

The first fortified made at Yalumba in 1852 was international in flavour, due to the plantings of Spanish and Portuguese varieties such as Grenache, Touriga, Tinta Cao, Tinta Madeira, Pedro Ximénez and Palomino in the Barossa.

From the connoisseurs of London's gentlemen's clubs to the British Raj in India, by the early 1900s Yalumba was supplying the world with these wines. In fact, on Christmas Day in 1929, a bottle of Yalumba Four Crown 'Port' found its way onto the table of Sir Douglas Mawson's Antarctic Expedition.

Following an age-old tradition from when they were first crafted in 1852, the very best barrels from each vintage continue to be selected and tucked away in the Museum Cellar. It is from these time capsules the Fortified Collection is blended each year. the very best barrels from each vintage




The Signature Vineyard Barossa Valley

In 2015, Yalumba began planting 72,000 vines in the famous Light Pass subregion of the Barossa Valley. Planted here are 16 different Shiraz and five different Cabernet Sauvignon clones, sourced from the Yalumba Nursery – the result of more than 10 years' work and 170 years of experience. The Signature Vineyard is a contemporary site designed to allow for climate change for the next 100 years. Its enriched soil profiles are key to growing grapes with a high level of complexity. Importantly, its proximity to the Valley's evening foothill breeze means the site remains free of frost, resulting in minimal fruit exposure and flavour depreciation.




Constructed largely from recycled materials, The Menzies Wine Room & Retreat is both a living and working space.
