2019 Devil's Corner Resolution Riesling

THE WINE

The nose is tight in its youth showing lime juice and slatey mineral lift. The mineral elements follow through to the palate with a pith texture. The acidity caries the citrus flavours for a long time on the palate and keeps the finish crisp and fresh. This Riesling is a bright, pale straw colour with tinges of green. The 2019 Devil's Corner Riesling is our second release of this wine. It will reward medium term cellaring of 4 to 8 years.

THE GRAPE VARIETY

Riesling produces wines of elegance and fragrance in Germany and France. An extraordinarily versatile variety, it produces wines ranging in style from crisp, delicate and aromatic to luscious, rich sweet dessert styles. It was one of the first varieties to be brought to Australia by European immigrants and is widely planted throughout the country. In areas that enjoy cool ripening conditions, it produces wines of tremendous depth of flavour and elegant structure.

TECHNICAL DETAILS

The Devil's Corner Resolution Riesling is from our cool climate Tasmanian vineyards. The 2019 vintage was excellent across the board with great ripening conditions and quality. Only free run juice is used in the Resolution Riesling providing the highest quality characteristics and acidity. The wine was fermented in tank under strict temperature control to maximise the integrity and impact of the vibrant fruit flavours. It was bottled with and alcohol of 13.5% a T.A. of 9.5 g/l and a pH of 3.06.

SERVING SUGGESTION

The Devil's Corner Resolution Riesling would be perfect with a range of seafood dishes. Salt and pepper calamari with a lime vinaigrette and aioli dipping sauce would be perfect. As would Bahn Me with bbq chicken and fresh Asian herbs. Don't forget the oysters!
