International medical graduates (IMGs) whose medical qualifications are from a medical school outside of Australia or New Zealand and who are seeking registration to practise medicine in Victoria must provide evidence of eligibility to undertake one of the following 3 assessment pathways.

Step 1: Identify a registration pathway

Standard Pathway >>

 Provide evidence of successful completion of the AMC Computer Adaptive Test (CAT) MCQ examination - eligible for Limited Registration

Note: Applicants who have also completed the AMC Clinical Examination are eligible for Provisional Registration rather than Limited Registration.

Competent Authority Pathway >>

Completed training or assessment with an approved competent authority
View approved competent authorities >>

Step 2: Meet the requirements for AHPRA Medical Registration (applies to all pathways)


- Medical Qualifications awarded by a training institution recognised by BOTH the Australian Medical Council and the World Directory of Medical Schools (WDOMS) >>
- Verify your medical qualifications through Primary Source Verification >>
- Meet the Medical Board of Australia (MBA) mandatory registration standards >>
 - Continuing Professional Development
 - Criminal History
 - English Language Skills
 - Recency of Practice
 - Professional Indemnity Insurance Arrangements
- Provide evidence of successful completion of a medical internship or comparable.

Step 3: Secure an employment offer

Note: IMGs applying for limited registration for area of need, to work in a general practice for the first time in Australia, must have at least three years (full time equivalent) experience working in general practice or primary care.

Pre-employment Structured Clinical Interview (PESCI)

What is a PESCI?

A PESCI is an objective assessment of your knowledge, skills, clinical experience and attributes to determine whether you are suitable to practise in a specific position. The PESCI consists of a structured clinical interview using scenarios. The information obtained from the PESCI is considered by the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) when it decides whether to grant registration.

Who needs a PESCI?

Applicants for limited or provisional registration may be required to complete a PESCI to work in **general practice**. Please contact AHPRA to advise you in your particular circumstance. IMGs in the **specialist pathway** do not require a PESCI, however a Fitness for Intended Clinical Practice Interview (FICPI) may be required by the relevant specialist medical college.
